FAQs

> Is Gamma Knife treatment effective?

It is as effective as the surgical approach, without the associated difficulties and risks.

> How fast can the treatment work?

In weeks or months, depending on the diagnosis.

> Can Gamma Knife be used on children?

Yes, but with the use of anesthesia if they are very young.

> What are the risks of radiation?

The risk to the rest of the brain and the body is 100 times less than alternative technologies.

> Is Gamma Knife treatment more expensive than conventional surgical treatment?

The overall cost is much lower, given that there are no hospitalization fees, absence from work, readmission due to side effects, etc.

> Is Gamma Knife Radiosurgery safe?

It is much safer than alternative treatment methods.

> Is the Gamma Knife procedure painful?

It is as painful as an injection.

> Will I experience any hair loss?

There is nearly never any hair loss, unless the defect is located very close to the skin.

> Can the Gamma Knife procedure cause other tumors to develop?

This has not been confirmed yet, but the chances are 1 in 20,000.

> How will I feel after the treatment?

The same as before.

> Can I return to work after the procedure?

Certainly, on the following day.

> How soon after the procedure will I be able to travel (by car, bus or train)?

As soon as the procedure has been completed, without any problems.
