AGREEMENT BETWEEN HYGEIA S.A. AND MED NET

The Athens Diagnostic and Treatment Centre HYGEIA S.A. would like to hereby announce that it has concluded an agreement with MedNet HELLAS S.A., a company that manages hospital care insurance schemes of some of the largest insurance companies in Greece.

With the said agreement HYGEIA S.A. shall directly cover the insured persons who MedNet Hellas S.A. represents for hospitalisation at the Athens Diagnostic and Treatment Centre under special terms, in terms of both physician fees and hospital expenses. The term of the agreement is set at three years and stipulates readjustments each year, while, concurrently, it guarantees the stabilisation of the average cost per hospital treatment for insurance companies.

This agreement aims to establish a new framework within which insurance companies shall collaborate with private hospitals based on fair terms, acceptable and profitable for all three parties (insurance companies, physicians and hospitals), while, concurrently, it guarantees high-quality medical and nursing services.

The agreement was concluded with the consenting opinion and participation, in each stage of deliberations that were held, of the Medical Association of HYGEIA S.A., which had been relatively authorised for this purpose by the General Meeting of the shareholders of HYGEIA S.A. It is the first time that the physicians and Management of a private hospital collaborated constructively to reach such a significant agreement that shall change the way insurance companies, physicians and private hospitals collaborate.

The new Management of HYGEIA S.A., with the support and consenting agreement of the company's physicians, has begun to implement its strategic decision to establish a new framework within which the company shall operate and collaborate not only with the insurance market but also, in general, with the health services sector, which shall be based on reliability, communication and efficiency, with the purpose of improving the quality and quantity of services that are provided to patients.
