LETO Honors Epameinondas Megapanos

LETO Hospital's lecture hall was named the "Epameinondas Megapanos Lecture Hall", in honor of the Hospital's Honorary President.

The naming ceremony was attended by the Mayor of Filothei-Psychico, Mr Pantelis Xyridakis the Chairman of HYGEIA Group, Mr Andreas Vgenopoulos and founding members of the Maternity Hospital.
