HYGEIA: Free-of-charge first-aid kits for the schools of Keratsini-Drapetsona

HYGEIA Hospital donated 110 first-aid kits stocked with medical supplies and medicinal products (essential/non-prescription) to the schools and organizations of the Municipality of Keratsini-Drapetsona.
